Dear Parishioners,

This weekend brings to a close National Vocation Awareness Week to raise awareness of the gift of a vocation to the priesthood and religious life. Vocations to the priesthood and religious life come from God but they must be nurtured because there are many influences in our world that can distract a young man or woman from God's call. Awareness of vocations is not just about learning of our own vocation but also recognizing that we all have a role in fostering vocations in the Church.

I read one priest's vocation story recently and he described how his family would go to Mass each week in two cars because they couldn't all fit into one car. One particular week, the young man's father sent everyone else home in one car and he and his son went together in the second car. On the ride home from Mass, the father had a very serious conversation with his son and told him that he thought that the son might be called to be a priest. The son had considered that possibility privately and now it was being affirmed by his own father! It was a turning point in his discernment of a call to the priesthood. That man did not become a priest because his father suggested it but his father's affirmation confirmed what was already in his heart and he has now been ordained for over ten years and is very happy and fulfilled in his life.

Many priests (and religious sisters as well) will tell you that there was someone—a priest, nun, parent, or friend—who encouraged them in their vocation. Perhaps you know someone who shows a true love of God and the qualities which would make him a good priest. It might even be your own son, grandson, or brother. Perhaps you know a woman whom you feel might be called to the religious life. Take a moment to invite them to consider if they are being called. Ask them to pray about it. In prayer, they might discern that they are not called to the priesthood religious life but your encouragement might be just enough for them to truly discern and say "yes" to God's invitation.

If you are someone who has been considering if God is calling you to the priesthood or religious life, then pray about it and have a conversation with a priest or a religious.

May the Lord open the hearts of men and women to respond generously in serving Him and His Church as priests and religious.
