*Roe V. Wade, Steve Jobs, the Beast and the Catholic Church....*

This weekend marks the sober and dark anniversary of Roe v. Wade, the now infamous Supreme Court decision allowing abortion on demand in the United States. Millions have died innocently. Millions of women (and men) are suffering with post-abortive stress. All of us know many people affected by this trauma and its effects. I recently read two books from *The New York Times* bestsellers list: *The Garden of the Beast* (about the American diplomat to Germany in World War II and his experiences there) and Steve *Jobs* by Walter Isaacson. We all know about Steve Jobs transformative success that has helped us all and the way we communicate.

I was struck by the creeping events in “the Garden” how the government and the laws emanating from that government deemed Jews no longer to be human. Once the laws changed and redefined who was human and to be protected “all hell” broke loose in a real way.

I was also struck in Steven Jobs’ biography how Steve was conceived out of wedlock outside of Green Bay, Wisconsin by a woman named Joanne from a very devout and Catholic family. The book reveals how the Catholic pro-life culture permeating the town made abortion a virtual forbidden option because of the deeply held ethos of the Catholic Church in the local people. Hence, Joanne went to San Francisco to give birth to Steve and offer him up for a closed adoption. In that Green Bay area, deeply infused by the primordial belief in the dignity of all human beings espoused by the Church, Steve Jobs’ life was spared and our lives were enriched.

I pray for the day Roe v. Wade is overturned which would simply mean each state will have to have a discussion on when human life begins and struggle to make laws that reflect the results of that debate. The deaths of little, unborn children are simply un-American and deadly. Join me in trying to make our legislature enact laws that incrementally protect human life, respect the dignity of all women and men, born and unborn. Pray Roe v. Wade is overturned and the real discussion begins about embryonic life. Until then, I pray in South County we work hard to create a culture of life where just like in the suburbs of Green Bay the cultural pressure to not hurt unborn life will be so strong women and men will have discussions like Joanne and the gifts of the lives like that of the Steve Jobs will enhance our lives and our nation.

May all those who have suffered in any way with abortion know in us the mercy and the love of God and the embrace of the Church and her forgiveness. May those who work for laws that define some persons as non-humans experience a change of heart.
