Dear Parishioners,

Recently, a government mandate was issued that requires employers, including religious institutions, to provide health coverage that includes contraception, sterilization, and abortifacients. This mandate would force Catholic institutions to purchase coverage for drugs and procedures that are opposed to the teaching of Christ. Underlying the legal separation of church and state issues in this mandate are moral issues involving procreation and respect for life. To understand the legal issues, our conscience must be properly formed to appreciate the moral issues.

Openness to children is a part of every marriage and every marital act. "A child does not come from outside as something added on to the mutual love of the spouses, but springs from the very heart of that mutual giving [in conjugal love], as its fruit and fulfillment" (CCC n. 2366). That said, spouses may, for just reasons, wish to space the birth of their children for a period of time, perhaps indefinitely. In fact, "The regulation of births represents one of the aspects of responsible fatherhood and motherhood. [However], legitimate intentions on the part of the spouses do not justify recourse to morally unacceptable means (for example, direct sterilization or contraception)" (CCC n. 2399). There are methods of regulating births through natural family planning which are safe, effective, and moral because they "respect the bodies of the spouses, encourage tenderness between them, and favor the education of an authentic freedom" (CCC n. 2370).

Once conceived, "Human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception" (CCC n. 2270). Procured abortion fails to respect the life of the human person in the womb.

Space does not allow for an in-depth review of these moral issues. The references to the Catechism give you a starting point if you are looking for additional information. Christopher West's *Good News About Sex and Marriage: Answers to Your Honest Questions About Catholic Teaching* is another good resource.

Let us first form our consciences properly and then pray that the laws and mandates of our country will respect our beliefs and allow us to follow our conscience.
