“Oh my gosh...we’re engaged!”

Wedding season is in full swing these days and it is a welcome sign of the springtime of new life. It can also be a time of spiritual growth and challenge. Couples today have to prepare for a wedding amidst great secular and material stress. Some tips for keeping Jesus at the center of it all.

1. Pray! Call upon the Holy Spirit as soon as you are engaged! Remember that marriage for Catholics/Christians is a calling and a vocation! Become more deeply aware of the reality of the covenant and vows that you are being called to. We don’t “decide” to marry ...we are called!
2. Entrust everything to the Lord. God already knows the date and time of your wedding...you just have to figure out where and when it is! This approach relieves you of the stress of details and opens up a couple to new possibilities.
3. Meet with a priest as soon as possible to explore your options and become more aware of the responsibilities to prepare properly and in a grounded fashion.
4. Don’t rush and complete your wedding party. Things may shift and look differently once the excitement gives way to real discernment and preparation.
5. Be flexible! It is the making of a new family but also the sharing and joining of two with different culture, traditions and expectations.
6. Go to confession! Confession? Yes, a marriage rooted in Jesus is a sharing in and revealing of unconditional love. Receiving unconditional love in reconciliation makes it more likely and easier to “pay it forward” so to speak after receiving it oneself.
7. Be sure to put as much effort, energy and planning into the marriage ceremony/mass as you do the reception! When asked where your wedding is, say “St. Thomas More” or “St. Veronica”, not the reception location. This is a chance to share your faith and the value of the sacrament of matrimony with your friends and colleagues.
8. Pray and discern who your guests should be and began praying for those that will come that they too share in some graces by witnessing the exchange of vows.
9. Make a donation to a charity that would honor the Lord instead of buying favors, extras.
10. Surrender the whole process to God’s Providence. There is no way every detail can be managed or planned. The Lord will do great things especially around such a grace-filled and planned celebration of His love.
11. Go to Mass faithfully and pray together at meals. Never negotiate this off the planning calendar. Sunday Mass is the one appointment no couple should ever cancel each week.
