Religious Liberties are under deep threat in RI

We have just celebrated the life and witness of St. Thomas More and Independence Day. We have also witnessed a great legislative tragedy in our state last week with the passage of Civil Unions legislation, which equates and legitimizes same sex unions on par with marriage. The passage of this really does undermine natural law, motherhood and fatherhood and marriage itself. It is truly a social experimentation.

All of us know and walk with and love persons with same-sex attractions. Some have members of families and close friends who experience this to varying degrees. The Church has and will continue to reach out pastorally to all persons especially in the realm of relationships, sexuality and love and attraction regardless of orientation. This is the mandate of the Gospel and the mission of the Church. The Church's vehement opposition to this legislation in the public square in no way diminishes its commitment to the pastoral care of all, nor is it a denial of their experiences.

This legislation is, however, a direct attack on marriage for all Rhode Islanders. One of the most disturbing things that happened last week was Governor Chafee's comments that he was troubled by the exemption of religious institutions from being legally forced and bound to support these new experimental laws. Already there is great concern among many Catholics who in conscience believe in chastity and the institution of marriage who may be challenged and possibly litigated against simply by adhering to Christ's teachings in their own lives and professions. Imagine requiring Catholic schools, universities and institutions to teach something believed to be against Divine Revelation! If religious liberties are not protected and religious conscience not respected there is no real freedom anymore.

Thomas More was beheaded over the issue of the bond of matrimony and his steadfast dedication to apostolic authority. He was opposed to the King's marriage precisely because he loved the King not because he didn't. The same remains true for those who oppose same-sex marriage and civil unions. May St. Thomas More intercede for us all, especially our Catholic politicians and representatives (in greater numbers in these days than in Thomas More's England) who have seemingly abandoned the apostolic tradition to which they belong. One can hear Thomas More's words "but Richard...for Wales?"

I'm sure St. Thomas More was discouraged in the Tower of London and was often told what he said or did wouldn't matter or change anything. His witness and voice rings through the centuries to today. We need the "Man for all Seasons" to intercede for us this summer as we have surely entered the fall and winter is on the horizon.

Let us pray, witness and love.
