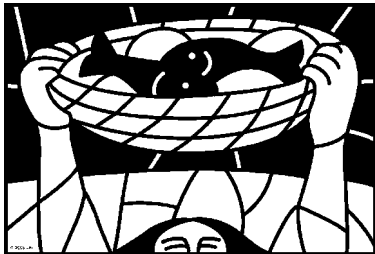
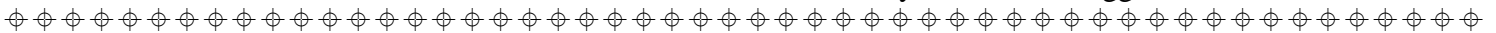

**SECOND COLLECTION**

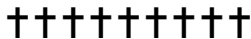

Fissette and I attended the Narragansett Zoning Board meeting with our attorney Robert Murray and Architect Paul St. Amand who has overseen our restoration of St. Thomas More Church this past year. We presented and were approved to go ahead with the restoration of the Carriage House at Rockland Street to be renovated to house two priests and to update storage facilities that are used for both churches. Many parishioners and neighbors came out to support our parish and its goals. Thank you! We now have to continue with formal application to the Historical District Committee and make formal presentation to the Diocese to move ahead. No doubt this approval was the major moment that will ensure proper priest-presence in the years ahead and allow us to save and restore a historically significant building in our town. Thanks, too, to the Building Committee members and those who have already donated to the *Remember, Restore, Renew* campaign.

Fr. Fissette is thriving among us and continues to find a warm welcome and a generous spirit in our parish. He continues to discover his other new ministry in vocations. Let his presence and this assignment be a consistent reminder to pray for vocations for our church.
