Dear Parishioners,

On Monday of this week we will celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Although it is not a holy day of obligation this year (because it falls on a Monday) we should nevertheless recall and celebrate this principal feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We will celebrate the regular daily Mass at 8:00AM at St. Veronica Chapel and 9:00AM at St. Thomas More Church on Monday in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary's Assumption.

This feast celebrates the belief that "the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up [assumed] body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death.' The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians."

While the dogma of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary body-and-soul into heaven was defined by Pope Pius XII in 1950, the belief in the Assumption goes back many, many centuries. So although the formal definition of the dogma is fairly recent, the belief goes back to the earliest days of the Church; what the pope formally declared in 1950 was already the common belief of the Church.

The celebration of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary each year calls us to focus on the eternal life which Mary shares body and soul with her Son, Jesus Christ. Through Jesus' saving action that promise of eternal life is open to each one of us.

Mary's Assumption is a foretaste of the glory which we all hope to share when our bodies will be raised on the last day. Each of us desires to be with God in heaven. In Mary's Assumption, we see the fulfillment of that hope that we all share to be with God body and soul one day in the eternal life He has prepared for us.
