The not so secret "CIA"

The acronym *CIA* stands for the *Central Intelligence Agency*. We have all heard of it but are not really sure how it all works but we are served by it everyday. In the Church there is another acronym that is the *RCIA* that stands for the *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults*. This is the program that many have heard mentioned but may not be sure how it really works. Too often the *RCIA* is also too much a well-kept secret.

This program starts each fall in most Catholic parishes and is a journey of inquiry and discovery about Catholicism. It is for those of either no faith background or a different faith tradition (Christian and non-Christian). It is also for those Catholics who never made the Sacraments of Confirmation.

I am sure there are many potential candidates for this program among our families, neighbors and friends. There is a team that meets usually on Tuesdays at 7:30 pm headed by Sue Davis and also including Eric Menke, Deacon Paul Sullivan and myself. There are guest presentations by Msgr. Halloran and Fr. Henry.

There is never any coercion or pressure but only an accompanying support of the team and sponsors along the way.

Those that feel called to complete their initiation into the church are received at the Easter Vigil and baptized and/or confirmed and receive the Holy Eucharist.

Each person comes to the program with his/her own history, graces gifts and struggles as we all have in our lives searching for Christ Jesus.

Do you know someone who could benefit from this program? Try to think and invite one person to the *Come and See* night on Tuesday October 4th. You, of course, would be welcome to accompany them that night although that is not necessary.

The *CIA* protects its secrets and our national interests. The *RCIA* exists so that Christ and the Catholic faith are known and not a well-kept secret.

Let us pray for all those discerning in their faith journey. May the Lord bring forth all those He is calling to *RCIA* at St. Thomas More.
