Reflections in the Rain...

I attended the Christmas tree lighting at St. Patrick Church parking lot this past Tuesday night. There were hundreds of people there and proudly I found some of our parishioners there, even some young children! It was a bitter sweet event. I felt proud to be with Catholics and followers of Jesus. The music in English and Spanish was Spirit filled and joyful. I also felt very heavy of heart. The very scene of us all in a downpour in a parking lot made me think of the Holy Family at the first Christmas who found no room at the Inn and the irony of our own situation.

I confess I felt most sad for our country and some of its leaders. I was alone and had time to reflect and pray. I thought about Governor Chafee and his decision to call the statehouse tree a “holiday” tree. I know that our great country was founded on freedom *of* religion but not *from* religion. There is no mention of separation of church and state in our Constitution. What I experienced in the parking lot was the absurdity of political correctness. The Jews and Muslims will be in their parking lots soon, too, I suspect unless we speak up. We are picking up speed on the slippery slope of intolerance under the guise of tolerance. To be sure Jesus Christ does not need a Blue Spruce to have his name on it to save us nor does He rely on this. Yet, the impossibility of His name being associated with the tree to honor his day of birth is radical and foreboding.

In 1990 I found myself as a seminarian in Prague, Czechoslovakia in a city that was celebrating Christmas publicly for the first time in decades. I will never forget the joy and the freedom felt by the Christians in the Czech Republic. I still recall our hostess Elena whose Christmas tree was hidden in a closed closet in her kitchen, opened for viewing only when the shades were drawn and all in the house were Christians. She was still afraid the government could fall and the old regime come back and she would be in trouble and lose her teaching job at the university. I stood in the rain in Providence on Tuesday night and remembered the freedom of the town square and church in Prague that night and the fear and sadness in the house all about a simple Christmas tree. I can't help but wonder where our state and country are going. I'm deeply concerned.

It was so appropriate it was raining. I pray for the Son to come out again soon.
