

### Event Details



#### How it Works

- Guests Register online & pay a fee to reserve a time to drive thru
- Arrive at Shaws parking lot for check in (instructions) and snack pack distribution
- Arrive at MCS and listen to pre-recorded narration of Christmas story while driving around school
- Enjoy scenes with student actors, lights, decorations and at the end an appearance from Santa along with a reminder to keep *Christ* in Christmas.



#### Our Vision

We envision this working similar to a drive-thru Christmas light experience.

The narration will be pre-recorded by the students of MCS. Attendees can connect via their phone or Bluetooth to listen as they drive through.

Scenes will be created using backdrops and silhouettes that we will construct. Student "actors" with non-speaking roles will be dressed in costume. Students will take turns working in shifts at each scene with adult supervision.

After the last scene, guests can enjoy the drivethru Christmas lights, decor, and decorated trees and catch a glimpse of Santa.
