APRIL 16, 2023 - THE SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER

Divine Mercy Sunday

This Sunday is the Second Sunday of Easter and the eighth day of the Easter Octave. It is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. The message of Divine Mercy is most associated with the Polish nun, St. Faustina Kowalska. In the 1930s, Sr. Faustina had extraordinary experiences in prayer. Jesus appeared to her and instructed her to write His words in a diary regarding new channels for the outpouring of His grace. This in no way is a new Gospel message. In fact, Sr. Faustina's task was to remind the Church and the world of the Biblical truth of God's merciful love for us, no matter how great our sins, and a call for us to entrust our lives to Him. This devotion to Divine Mercy that Jesus gave her includes the Image of Divine Mercy, the Feast of Divine Mercy, the Chaplet and Novena of Divine Mercy, and the Hour of Mercy. You can read all of St. Faustina's conversations with Jesus in her book, *Divine Mercy in My Soul: Diary of St. M. Faustina Kowalska*.

Pope John Paul II said in his homily at St. Faustina's canonization: "Today my joy is truly great in presenting the life and witness of Sr. Faustina Kowalska to the whole Church as a gift of God for our time... Christ entrusted His message of mercy to her... It is not a new message but can be considered a gift of special enlightenment that helps us to relive the Gospel of Easter more intensely, to offer it as a ray of light to the men and women of our time." In 2000, Pope John Paul II proclaimed that the Second Sunday of Easter would be celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday.

What is Divine Mercy Sunday? Jesus told St. Faustina,

"I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet...It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy." (Diary, 699)

In other words, this is an extraordinary grace of the *complete* forgiveness of sins, as well as, being cleansed of the temporal punishment due to sin. Fr. Michael Gaitley, MIC explains how we can receive this special grace. "You simply need to go to confession before or on the feast...be in the state of grace (no mortal sin), and

receive Holy Communion with the intention of obtaining the promised grace. Of course, we should also do acts of mercy such as forgiving people, praying for others, and having the intention to be more merciful to our neighbor."


Why, in our time, does God want to give us such a great grace? Precisely because today there is so much sin and evil in the world. "Where sin increased, grace overflowed all the more." (Romans 5:20) Jesus also told St. Faustina, "The greater the sinner, the greater the right he [or she] has to my mercy." Now is the time of great mercy!

Veneration of the Cross Service


