

# The Feast of the Assumption

We just celebrated the Feast of the Assumption this past week. This Feast is of great importance to us in a way that needs to lead to refection, prayer and hope. Mary was given the prevenient grace in being asked to be the Mother of Jesus Christ. She said yes, and conceived the only Son of God. The tradition of Mary's body being assumed into heaven at her death makes sense in that she has gone before us, experiencing the fullness of eternal life that is promised to us who believe.

The Feast is cause for a pause. Do you believe the last line of the creed that we pray each Sunday, "I believe in the resurrection of the body"? This is one of the real reasons that Catholics honor the body with Christian burial and are not able to scatter the body whenever possible. I have seen a change in how people view the body and how we treat the body after death. It seems that many say they believe the soul lives forever.

I have at times heard people ruminate that our dead relatives are doing things that would require a body in heaven. Things like cooking, golfing, etc. Whenever I hear this I know that they innocently have not reflected on the resurrection of the body on the Last Day, nor do they fully understand the significance of the hope we find in the Assumption of Mary.

God created us soul and body. At our baptism we became a temple of the Holy Spirit. It only makes sense that God in His infinite goodness would raise us up as He did His Son on Easter morning.

Think of the centrality of the bodily resurrection of Jesus and the first hand accounts of people recognizing Him in his glorified bodily wounds. Why Easter? Why the Assumption? Because God desires this for us too.

Lets reflect on heaven and who and what it is and isn't, as the summer closes and the Assumption bids us to go forward in faith, body and soul.

Topic: By popular demand—The Letters of the Apostolic Fathers

St. Clement of Rome, St. Ignatius of Antioch and St. Polycarp of Smyrna. These are three bishop martyrs who lived in the generation after the apostles. Through their letters, they give us our first peak into the formation of the earliest Church in the context of the Roman Empire of the late first and early to mid second centuries. They are heroic, fighting off heresy from within the early Church as well as persecution from without. Today our own Catholic faith and morality are challenged by our secular culture and ever emerging ideologies. Come read with us and be encouraged and inspired. This faith has survived two thousand years!

These readings are not in the Bible. Here are two options:

1) They can be downloaded and printed for free at www.earlychristianwritings.com. Scroll down in the first column and find "1 Clement" (1 letter), "Ignatius of Antioch" (seven letters) and "Polycarp to the Philippians" (1 letter) and print them; OR

Purchase online an anthology of Early Christian Writings. I use "Early Christian Fathers" by Westminster John Knox Press, ed. C.R. Richardson. There are several editions.
