A Word From Fr. Unsworth

Since I am only the temporary Administrator of the Parish, and the Parish news is not as extensive as it is during the rest of the year, I thought I would offer a series of little articles during the Summer months about the 10 Commandments. Each Commandment tells us something about the importance of our relationship with God and our moral responsibility towards one another. I hope you find this short series helpful.

The 7th Commandment "Thou shall not steal."

More than 30 years ago I read a great little book by Robert Fulghum entitled, "All I Really Need To Know, I Learned In Kindergarten." He states that as a small child, we all learned to pick up things we dropped, put back things we took, clean up our own mess and don't take things that don't belong to us. The Seventh Commandment, however, is not only about honesty in our own personal behavior, but also in the behavior of corporations, institutions, and governments as well.

If we were to list some of the important sins this commandment forbids they would include: plagiarism, theft, embezzlement and shoplifting. But there are also many subtle ways we break this Commandment. For instance, when we take information from the internet and then try to pass it off as our own work, we are stealing. When we back into someone's car, causing damage, and then drive away without leaving a note, we are taking money from that person who now must pay for the repairs.

Regardless of what form the theft takes, those who take from others damage the harmony of society. In the days of Moses, there were no police or prisons. If a person was caught stealing the donkey or ox belonging to his neighbor, and that neighbor relied on that animal for his livelihood, the thief was often put to death. Even today, in some countries, governed by strict Islamic Law, a thief could lose his or her hand for stealing.

The teaching of our Church is that those who steal, in whatever form it takes, must perform restitution (returning what was stolen). You need to give it back or make it right. The Church also asks us to consider the need of others and not just ourselves. The spirit of the Seventh Commandment is to remember to always be a person of generosity and to believe that the world's goods were intended to be shared by all.

The Seventh Commandment calls us all to be good stewards. That means that we have the will and intelligence to be in charge and not to dominate or overpower, but to create a just and reasonable society, using the earth's resources. It is up to us to see that the goods of the earth are distributed in a just and charitable way to every person in the world.







The diocese of Providence is hosting several Information Sessions for all men interested in becoming a permanent deacon. To choose a session go to dioceseofprovidence.org/information-sessioons-permanent-diaconate-program to complete and submit a registration for a particular session. This will help us ensure that we have sufficient materisal for each Information Session. If a man is married, his wife is cordially invited and encouraged to attend the presentation.

About the Info sessions

Each session will begin with a brief prayer and introcuction. There will be a powerpoint presentation covering:

- the history and service of the diaconate
- a description of the Program of Formation
- a description of the Application process.

There will be time for questions and answers. Printed materials and an application will be provided at each session. Attendance at a session will not obligate anyone. The process will begin when a man returns his completed application and required documentation to the Office of Deacons.


