A Word From Fr. Unsworth

Since I am only the temporary Administrator of the Parish, and the Parish news is not as extensive as it is during the rest of the year, I thought I would offer a series of little articles during the Summer months about the 10 Commandments. Each Commandment tells us something about the importance of our relationship with God and our moral responsibility towards one another. I hope you find this short series helpful.

The 4th Commandment "Honor Your Father and Your Mother."

Although the Fourth Commandment originally protected elderly parents, it came to include the duties of younger children to their parents. As we grow older, however, honoring parents includes financial assistance, personal services, and respect. The first 3 Commandments speak of our duties to God, the 4th Commandment is the first Commandment that gives us a list of duties toward human beings, because a person's closest human ties are with his or her parents.


Sometimes the Fourth Commandment is thought to refer exclusively to a child's unquestioning obedience to a parent. Christian obedience is broader. It encompasses compassion in the one who commands and understanding in the one who obeys. Parent-child relationships are not meant to be based on force or fear. A family is not a "prison" situation where "inmates" obey the "guards" to avoid being punished. Good communication is the key to a healthy relationship between parents and children.

HONOR THE ELDERLY. "Gray hair is a crown of glory; it is gained by virtuous living" (Proverbs 16:31). An elderly person is a unique individual with the rare advantage of having already experienced many of life's gifts and challenges. He or she can evaluate what is important and pass on this wisdom, but it cannot be shared unless someone comes to receive it. Many older people are afraid to be a burden on younger people, and so they are unwilling to offer their wisdom unless that are asked to do so. It is better for all of us if we listen when they speak.

ALL AUTHORITY COMES FROM GOD. The Fourth Commandment also demands that everyone who is in authority over others should always strive to use persuasion, intelligence and goodwill when exercising their authority. This includes teachers, military officers, pastors, managers or anyone who has a strong influence over others.

St. Paul, in his letter to the Philippians (2:14-16), offers us wisdom on the importance of obedience. "Do everything that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine like lights in the world as you hold on to the word of life, so that my boast for the day of Christ may be that I did not run in vain or labor in vain."

The perfect parents probably don't exist. In the same way, the perfect child (with the exception of Jesus & Mary) has yet to be born. Let the 4th Commandment by your guide in your relationships with those in authority over you and you will bring God's peace to the world in your own small but powerful way.





The diocese of Providence is hosting several Information Sessions for all men interested in becoming a permanent deacon. To choose a session go to dioceseofprovidence.org/information-sessioons-permanent-diaconate-program to complete and submit a registration for a particular session. This will help us ensure that we have sufficient materisal for each Information Session. If a man is married, his wife is cordially invited and encouraged to attend the presentation.

About the Info sessions

Each session will begin with a brief prayer and introcuction. There will be a powerpoint presentation covering:

- the history and service of the diaconate
- a description of the Program of Formation
- a description of the Application process.

There will be time for questions and answers. Printed materials and an application will be provided at each session. Attendance at a session will not obligate anyone. The process will begin when a man returns his completed application and required documentation to the Office of Deacons.

We would like all applications by August 15, 2024 in order to begin scheduling interviews in September.
