
KEEPING THE FAITH IN SUMMER

I don't remember anyone announcing that God is taking the summer off, but many would like to think He does. Coaches and athletic leagues schedule games on Sundays without even asking the churches what their schedules are and they certainly don't seem to care if the kids have no time to go to Mass. Their priorities say to the children that the game is more important than their time with God and it places parents and kids in the impossible position of having to choose between sports and God. Unfortunately, God often lands in second place.

Here are some suggestions for keeping the faith during the summer months:

- 1. **MAKE TIME FOR GOD:** After all, He made time for you. Whatever you are planning for the weekend, treat Him like one of the family and don't leave Him out of your plans. There are Catholic churches everywhere give Him a few minutes of your time.
- 2. **DON'T FORGET YOUR SUPPORT** for St. Thomas More Parish. When you're away it is nice to give a few dollars to the cute little church you are visiting, but remember that back home bills still have to be paid with fewer people showing up to help. *Make-up your budgets when you get home*.
- 3. **GET THE KIDS TO CHURCH:** It's not quite as easy to get out of bed on a warm summer morning, but kids should never get the impression that if they don't feel like going to church, they don't have to. Jesus didn't feel like dying for us, but He did because He loved us. Do not keep your children away from the Eucharist they need God's love too.

Short shorts, tank tops, bathing suits, bare feet can be quite a distraction to others (and not always a pleasant one). Try to use common sense and good taste when you are in God's house He always looks His best for you.





This will help us ensure that we have sufficient materisal for each Information Session. If a man is married, his wife is cordially invited and encouraged to attend the presentation.

About the Info sessions

Each session will begin with a brief prayer and introcuction. There will be a powerpoint presentation covering:

- the history and service of the diaconate
- a description of the Program of Formation
- a description of the Application process.

There will be time for questions and answers. Printed materials and an application will be provided at each session. Attendance at a session will not obligate anyone. The process will begin when a man returns his completed application and required documentation to the Office of Deacons.

We would like all applications by August 15, 2024 in order to begin scheduling interviews in September.


