St Thomas More...a man for our season

June 22nd is the Feast of St. Thomas More, our patron. Thomas More was a lawyer, judge, statesman who lost his life opposing King Henry VIII's plan to subordinate the Catholic Church to English monarchy.

He attended Oxford, spoke several languages and was versed in mathematics, music and literature. He was deeply contemplative and considered joining the Carthusians, one of the most ascetical and penitential religious orders. He practiced serious physical mortifications and kept a prayer schedule throughout his life. He married and had four children. His wife died during childbirth and he would marry again to Alice, a widow.

Henry VIII had great admiration and appointed Thomas More Lord Chancellor, and he oversaw the court system. Thomas even authored a book for Henry VIII defending Catholicism against Martin Luther! King Henry wanted to annul his marriage to Catherine of Aragon that Pope Clement VII declared valid and indissoluble. Henry VIII declared that every English citizen had to swear an oath that his marriage to Anne Boleyn was valid, otherwise you were committing treason. Thomas More refused to disavow the authority of the Church over sacraments and was arrested and put into the Tower of London. For fifteen months his wife and others tried to convince him to sign, and he said he had to follow his conscience. In 1535 an act was passed declaring Henry VII to be head of the Church of England, on earth in essence equal to the pope. Catholic clergy that refused were being executed.

Thomas More was eventually put on trial and found guilty. He is famous for his statement, "I die the kings' good servant but God's first.

St. John Fisher, the only English bishop that remained Catholic was executed on June 22nd and they share a feast day. Hence, you will find a window for both men in the stained glass of St. Veronica Chapel.

Our parish was founded as St. Philomena as you might know, but in the 1960's was changed to St. Thomas More. I do not know the particulars of this, as it is highly unusual. I will say that the providence of God knew our diocese would need a community to raise the witness of St. Thomas More to be considered.

The times in which we live see many abandoning their consciences formed by Christ and the Church as soon as they practice their professional life or a life of public service. I hope you have seen the excellent film, "A Man for All Seasons". St Thomas More is for our season. His conscience lived in the spring and summer of fidelity in the midst of the winter of culture and times. Now he is with Christ and the saints. St. Thomas prays for us and especially for those in law and public life that espouse Jesus Christ. Happy Feast!






Mission Co-op with Br. Gauthier

Topic: By popular demand—The Letters of the Apostolic Fathers

St. Clement of Rome, St. Ignatius of Antioch and St. Polycarp of Smyrna. These are three bishop martyrs who lived in the generation after the apostles. Through their letters, they give us our first peak into the formation of the earliest Church in the context of the Roman Empire of the late first and early to mid second centuries. They are heroic, fighting off heresy from within the early Church as well as persecution from without. Today our own Catholic faith and morality are challenged by our secular culture and ever emerging ideologies. Come read with us and be encouraged and inspired. This faith has survived two thousand years!

These readings are not in the Bible. Here are two options:

1) They can be downloaded and printed for free at www.earlychristianwritings.com. Scroll down in the first column and find "1 Clement" (1 letter), "Ignatius of Antioch" (seven letters) and "Polycarp to the Philippians" (1 letter) and print them; OR

Purchase online an anthology of Early Christian Writings. I use "Early Christian Fathers" by Westminster John Knox Press, ed. C.R. Richardson. There are several editions.
