The Feast of Corpus Christi – The Body and Blood of Christ. Amen means, "I believe it!" Do we?

"Very truly I tell you, unless you eat my body and drink my blood you have no life in you", John 6:53.

Catholics have professed and believed in the true presence of Jesus in the Eucharist since the Last Supper. Sadly, many "cradle Catholics" haven't really reflected on the reality and what it means. I just read that 1.5% of the population in America is a convert to Catholicism. Teaching OCIA (classes) throughout all of my priesthood has me reflecting on the Eucharist, which is sometimes a stumbling block on the way to the fullness of Christ, but most often it is the draw.

Several years ago, a best man that came to St. Thomas More felt the Real Presence during the wedding Mass. He was a lapsed Protestant. Shortly afterward, he entered OCIA at St. Thomas More and was confirmed at our parish at the Easter Vigil.

I was blessed last year to walk with Gordon Hayward, a Lutheran who also came to believe that the Eucharist is really Jesus. There is a saying, "converts make the best Catholics". While not always the case, this Feast of Corpus Christi is an opportunity for us to reflect on the gift of the Real Presence. Some say, why didn't Jesus just remain here with us? We know now He would have been in a particular place at one time, now in the Eucharist, he is physically present all over the world and so close to us.

Many have the older tradition of blessing themselves when they pass by a Catholic Church and reverence the presence. Might this be something you try to discover? Maybe we slow down our genuflections, so our interior self and our intellect can also genuflect with our body.

May I suggest you read John chapter six. This is the discourse of Jesus about the Eucharist. Would you be able to explain to a protestant the difference between a Eucharistic theology that is symbolic rather than the Real Presence?

Perhaps google a litany of the Eucharist and pray it today. Jesus, we thank you for dying, rising and instituting this way to stay with us. We love, honor and adore you.

During challenging times, especially over the past year or so, most of us have most likely felt the "pinch" one time or another with escalating costs for food, gas, utilities, medical bills, etc. Having to pick and choose which bills to pay each month is very stressful, and for some, it's a weekly or monthly issue.

Through our Catholic faith, we show our love for Jesus by helping others in many ways. Mother Teresa was a beautiful example of how to show love by helping those in need. In response to the generosity of the parishioners over the years wanting to help those in need, St. Thomas More established the "The Mother Teresa Fund" in XXXX to enable parishioners to quietly donate to causes that aren't seen by us every day. The help can be as simple as providing a food or gas card, paying for a past-due utility bill, or supporting the Providence inner-city schools that are struggling to stay open. Below are some examples of how the Mother Teresa Funds have been used:

- Food and gas card assistance regularly throughout the community
- Partnering with St. Vincent DePaul Conference, St. Francis of Assisi, Wakefield, to provide aid to Narragansett and South Kingstown residents who have fallen behind on bills, rent, etc., for various reasons.
- Donating to the "Kitchen of Hope" a non-profit volunteer organization that provides free, hot, nutritious meals to the underserved in Narragansett and South Kingstown.
- Assisting with St. Patrick Academy in Providence to help provide a Catholic college-prep education to students in Providence (maybe mention lockers & uniforms?)
- Enable Bishop McVinney School in Providence to rent school buses for a field trip to the Roger Williams Park Zoo.
- Donations to the Emmanuel Center in Providence (what is the Emmanuel center?)
- Sound System for St. Charles Church in Providence
