There is a controversy, as I am sure you have heard about, regarding the Los Angeles Dodgers and the "Sisters of Perpetual Indulgence. Next month, there is a scheduled performance/appearance of these "sisters" at a baseball game.

They were invited, disinvited, and re-invited. The members of this group are undoubtedly mocking Catholic beliefs and practices, the countless religious sisters and nuns that have served and continue to serve God's people as true brides of Christ. - Pray for the good and dedicated religious sisters and nuns we know (Capuchin Sisters of Nazareth, Daughters of Nazareth, Trappistine Sisters, Dominicans, Carmelites, and others.)
- Write a thoughtful and respectful letter to the LA Dodgers asking them to refrain from hosting groups that commit blasphemy and mockery of any religion, especially Catholicism.




