Why do we cover statues at the end of Lent?

Next week we will cover our statues of Jesus and Mary as well as the crucifixes. This is an ancient tradition that is an option pastors/parishes can take as we do here at St. Thomas More. It is counter-intuitive to cover the statues that remind us of heaven and our ultimate goal. As we get ever closer to Holy Week we cover them to sort of "jolt" our senses. Covering the statues usually makes one ask, especially children, "What is going on?".

Veils or veiling remind us too, of heaven. We think of a bride that until recently arrived to the covenant veiled or hidden from her groom. The veil pointed to the longing for convent and the purity and virginity of the bride. We veil the Easter flowers until our Vigil, raising the anticipation of the resurrection of Jesus. Girls wear veils at First Communion reminding us that the church is the bride of Christ at Holy Mass.

Sometimes we veil a new portrait or painting from view that serves only to deepen the longing to see what is hidden. The same is done for sculptures or statues at dedications.

Of course in Jerusalem there was a veil in the temple in the Holy of Holies, that we read in scripture was torn in two, as Christ died exposing heaven to earth and earth to heaven. Christ has lifted the veil as now in the Incarnation we can experience and see the face of Jesus.

Here in our parish we veil them in purple for the fourth week of Lent and red for Holy Week.

I would recommend you could do this in the domestic church of your home. If you have a crucifix or statue/s in the house, covering them the fifth week of Lent until the Easter Vigil is a similar but different practice of placing the baby Jesus in the manger on Christmas morning.

Church law requires abstinence from meat (for those 14 and older) on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent. In addition, Ash Wednesday, and Good Friday are fast days: Those between the ages of 18 and 59 should eat less – no solid food between meals only one full meal and 2 smaller ones. (One's health can excuse you from these rules).


Requesting your help ~ next two weekends!


