## It's Holy Week – Let us become holy!

There is only one week a year called "holy," for good reason. It is a time set apart from all other weeks. We should be more attracted and excited about it than Christmas, the birthdays of those we love, or Superbowl Sunday.

The week is full of drama, to be sure. Palm Sunday Mass is unique in that it starts on a high with Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, and about 20 minutes later, we are asked to say, "Crucify Him, crucify Him!" A woman once told me after Mass that she wouldn't say those words since they make her uncomfortable, which made me sad as I don't think she is open to the whole experience of Holy Week. It should make us uncomfortable, challenged, reflective, and, in the end, exuberant with joy.


Have you ever done the whole Triduum of Holy Week starting on Thursday evening, when we commemorate the Last Supper, the first Mass, and the Institution of the Sacred Priesthood? The Lord is left in the Tabernacle in St. Thomas More until late in the evening so you can spend time with Him, just as He was alone overnight in the cell of the basement of the High Priest, Caiaphas.

Good Friday is a day of complete fasting, so we only eat one full meal, abstaining from meat, etc. We will walk in the streets at noon and then have traditional stations in the church at 3 PM. In the evening at the 7 PM Service, we will read the Passion and receive Holy Communion, which is stored from Holy Thursday, as there is no Mass anywhere in the world from Holy Thursday until sundown on Holy Satuday.

Easter is a day of joy, but only in as much as we entered into Jesus's suffering and sorrow in the days before. This year, we are adding an Easter egg hunt outside St. Veronica Chapel following 11 AM Mass.

Please try to come to everything. If we have a good Holy Week, it will make us more like Jesus...holy!



Holy Week is a week for being mindful. We must set loose the baggage of Lent, and not be deterred by the dazzling sunrise of Easter morning beckoning in the distance.

In my opinion it's one of the best feelings there is: the yearning we have in our hearts for the Resurrection as we embark on Palm Sunday.
