Fasting and Abstinence Reminder

Church law requires abstinence from meat (for those 14 and older) on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent. In addition, Ash Wednesday, and Good Friday are fast days: Those between the ages of 18-59 should eat less – no solid food between meals only one full meal and 2 smaller ones. (One's health can excuse you from these rules).


Requesting your help ~ next two weekends!




