Reflection for the Feast of Pentecost, May 19, 2024 John 17:1-11

Today's Gospel paints a picture about Pentecost that is a colorful description of the spectacular beginnings of the infant Church as an active missionary community. The Holy Spirit, like a roaring wind, descends with tongues of fire on the heads of the

apostles. The immediate impact on the apostles is radical and dramatic. Inspired by the Spirit of God they boldly go out to the market place and proclaim the resurrection of Christ and his conquest of sin and death. They are no longer a terrified and cowardly collection of individuals locked away in the upper room for fear of being crucified themselves. They emerge full of enthusiasm, gifted with eloquence and with a very clear sense of their vocation.

The thought strikes me that the first Pentecost must have been an exciting time to be alive in the Church. The atmosphere was joyful, change was in the air and the outpouring of God's love upon all of creation was like a river flooding the earth. However, the coming of the Holy Spirit was not something that happened only at the birth of the Church. The living breath of God is at work in every age as a permanent feature renewing the building up of the body of the Church.

The gifts of the Holy Spirit, given at Pentecost, and for us at our Confirmation, are available to the worshipping community gathered each Sunday, provided we are open to receiving it. It seems a shame that many of our young people, and their families, see Confirmation, not as a new beginning as it was for the apostles at Pentecost, but as an end of their need to go to church and practice their faith in any meaningful way. What the Church needs to do is to engage these young people in the life of the parish throughout their years in High School so that they can recognize and understand the wonderful power of the Holy Spirit working through them.

This feast of Pentecost is an excellent opportunity for all of us to evaluate the use we are making of our own God-given gifts. We are all laborers whom the Lord asks to go into the harvest. It is in the ordinary things of life that we share most fully in the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

A Movie Day hosted by the St. Thomas More Men's Bible Study Group

Come and join us on Pentecost Sunday, May 19 at 2PM, for a showing of the movie, "Of Gods and Men", a powerful film says Msgr. Halloran based on the true story of the life of the Cistercian monks of Tibehirine in Algeria from 1993 until their kidnapping in 1996. The movie tells a story of eight French Christian monks who live in harmony with their Muslim brothers in the town, one of the monks opening an infirmary to serve the local population.

When a crew of foreign workers is massacred by an Islamic fundamentalist group, fear sweeps through the region. The army offers the monks protection from the extremists, and strongly suggests that they leave the country, and return to France. Should they leave? Despite the growing menace in their midst, they slowly realize that they have no choice but to stay...come what may. Rated PG-13, the film contains some graphic violence not suitable for young eyes. Jesus said in Sunday's gospel, "No one has greater love than this, than to lay down one's life for one's friends."

The film will be presented in the church hall at St. Thomas More on **Sunday, May 19th from 2-4:00 p.m.** with time for discussion, questions, and answers after the film.

GOSPEL MEDITATION -May 19, 2024 - Pentecost Sunday

When I was twenty-two years of age in August of 2000, I experienced World Youth Day in Rome. As for many of my generation, the event was life-changing for me. Surrounded by joyful, hope-filled young people from seemingly every nation and tongue, we were gathered around the Pope, sharing a common Faith and love. The Pope spoke to us of our shared family bond in the Church and invited us to give our lives in service to others.

Now twenty-four years later,my life as a priest, like that of so many others from those special days, continues on that same path of love and unity – despite my many weaknesses. What makes that continuation possible?

This week's feast gives the answer: the Holy Spirit.

The gift of God – His very life – the third person of the Trinity, is the Spirit who animates the entire Church and each member of it. He makes us one-in-love in a way that utterly exceeds human capacity. For example, he makes the apostles speak with tongues of fire, and everyone hears them in his own native tongue. The Holy Spirit is the means by which Jesus establishes a new family, one that crosses all possible boundaries of time, space, and culture. The Holy Spirit never tires in enthusing us for mission.

<u>Information Sessions for Men</u> <u>Interested in the Permanent Diaconate</u>

The diocese of Providence is hosting several Information Sessions for all men interested in becoming a permanent deacon. To choose a session go to <u>dioceseofprovidence.org/information-sessioons-permanent-diaconate-program</u> to complete and submit a registration for a particular session. This will help us ensure that we have sufficient materisal for each Information Session. If a man is married, his wife is cordially invited and encouraged to attend the presentation.

About the Info sessions

Each session will begin with a brief prayer and introduction. There will be a powerpoint presentation covering:

- the history and service of the diaconate
- a description of the Program of Formation
- a description of the Application process.

There will be time for questions and answers. Printed materials and an application will be provided at each session. Attendance at a session will not obligate anyone. The process will begin when a man returns his completed application and required documentation to the Office of Deacons.

We would like all appications **by August 15, 2024** in order to begin scheduling interviews in September.
