EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP -RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

The Daily Examen of Stewardship

"Stewardship" can get a bum rap these days. When folks hear the term "stewardship" from the pulpit, their eyes tend to kind of glaze over. "Here's Father asking for more money," they groan inwardly, "Get ready for the passing of the pledge cards."

Christ refutes this idea when he gives us what he calls the greatest commandments — instructing us to love God and to love our neighbor. Now, Christ is a man who chose his words carefully. He meant exactly what he said — and he didn't say that the greatest commandments were to tithe and to give money to charity. If he had wanted stewardship to be only about money, he would have said so.

Sometimes we are indeed called to show our love for God and neighbor in the form of a financial gift. But the concept of Everyday Stewardship — living mindfully in prayer, grateful for our blessings, and gracious to our neighbors, committed to God, and accountable to each other — is about so much more.

I propose a twist on the long-held practice of the "Daily Examen" — a pious devotion wherein, at day's end, we go over the events of the last 24 hours and discern God's will. A Daily Examen of Stewardship might contain questions like this:

How did I love God today? In whom did I love Him? What did God give me today? With whom did I share it? What did I give to Him? To whom did I reach out today? Who reached out to me? Where was God on my list of priorities today? First? Second? Third, fourth?

St. Thomas More Mother Teresa Fund

Through generous donations made by parishioners to our outreach program, "Mother Teresa Fund," St. Thomas More has donated \$25,000 to the "Kitchen of Hope" project. The "Kitchen" is a non-profit volunteer organization that provides free, hot, nutritious meals to the underserved in Narragansett and South Kingstown.

From its beginning in 2020 during COVID, they have provided over 39,000 meals all prepared and delivered from the kitchen at the Peace Dale Congregational Church. Since the demand and need have increased to feed more individuals and families in South County, a larger facility is needed. The "Kitchen" is being relocated to St. Francis of Assisi Church and will be equipped with commercial cooking facilities to permit expansion of the program, which will help meet the needs of so many.

As a parish that so joyously helps those in need, St. Thomas More is proud to partner with the "Kitchen of Hope" and St. Francis of Assisi Parish to continue to help those in need.

Feeding the Whole Person

The Kitchen of Hope service often identifies needs beyond food insecurity that they are able to assist through other ministries of the parish, or with our partners in the community. Examples have included: home and yard repair or maintenance; wheelchair ramp installation; rent, utility, or clothing assistance; wellness checks; financial literacy and spiritual needs. This robust kitchen facility could also evolve to include free job training opportunities in the local food and hospitality industries.

Kitchen of Hope Mission Statement

In the Spirit of St. Francis of Assisi, we elevate food security by providing healthy meals to local individuals and families. We are building a community of volunteers and donors through our participation in our weekly dinner delivery and in-house dining ministries. Our aim is to uplift those we serve by being a "Kitchen of Hope," promoting dignity, self-respect, and well-being.




