We have a new application that makes it easier to be scheduled, and for parents and children's preferences. 

St. Teresa of Ávila Feast Day October 15

St. Teresa of Ávila (1515-1582) was a Spanish Carmelite nun who lived in the 16th century. She was a mystic and author of spiritual writings and poems. The originator of the Carmelite Reform, she founded numerous convents throughout Spain and restored a contemplative life to the order. She became well known for the mystical experiences, many of which she described in her autobiography.

The first of only four women to be named a Doctor of the Church, St. Teresa's ascetic doctrine and Carmelite reforms shaped Roman Catholic contemplative life, and her writings on the Christian soul's journey to God are considered works of art. Her writings, especially the "Way of Perfection" and "The Interior Castle," have helped generations of believers.

St. Teresa of Avila died on Oct. 15, 1582. She was canonized on March 22, 1622, along with three of her greatest contemporaries: St. Ignatius Loyola, St. Francis Xavier, and St. Philip Neri.

Parish Council Nomination Form

The Nomination Committee will be accepting nominations for the eight at-large seats on the Parish Council, effective January 1, 2026. The St. Thomas More Parish Council represents the body of the Church, which oversees parish activities, projects, and many other facets of parish life. The committee is comprised of the Pastor, Religious Education Director, staff members, leaders of various ministries, and eight elected positions.

The elected positions will consist of:

2 parishoners for the 16-22 year old age group

4 parishioners for the 23-59 year old age group

2 parishioners for the 60+ year old age group

Election shall be for a three year term. The Council ordinarily meets four times per year.

You may submit your own name, or that of any other parishioner 16 years or older. If you are submitting the name of someone else, please obtain their permission. Nominations may be dropped off at the parish office, emailed to stmoffice53@gmail.com, or placed in the collection basket during any of the Masses.

Nominations will be accepted for two weeks, from Sunday, September 28 to Sunday, October 12.

All nominees will then be contacted to verify their acceptance and obtain some general background information.

On October 25 & 26, we will list in the bulletin, all those running for office, along with a brief bio of all the candidates.

On the weekends of November 2 & 9, ballots will be in the bulletin and available at all church entrances for parishoners to vote. This will be a two week period.

On the weekend of November 16th, results will be published in the bulletin.
