



Seminarians are often out of sight and out of mind. Their lives are busy studying, praying, and discerning. Their studies cover theology, philosophy, canon law, and languages, while daily spiritual practices include Mass and the Liturgy of the Hours.

We are blessed here at St. Thomas More to have several seminarians visit our parish throughout the year. In November, we are preparing to welcome five seminarians from Bismarck, North Dakota, who are studying in Washington. We also recently hosted four seminarians from the Archdiocese of the Military.


Seminary life is often a blessed experience, but at times can be challenging. You don't usually get to see pastoral life up close, especially at the beginning. Some men, of course, discern out, which is part of a healthy seminary life.

I recall feeling during certain periods in the seminary, that ordination seemed so far off, and I would question whether it was all worth the journey. I also remember how much I enjoyed getting notes and letters from back home, as I was in Rome for many years, when there was no social media. Sometimes a note or letter would come just when the Lord knew I needed the encouragement.

This weekend, we are having the collection to support these men, but let's not forget to support them with our prayers as well. Know a seminarian? Why not write a note the old-fashioned way to let them know they are thought of and prayed for?

God bless all seminarians, especially those from Providence, Bismarck, the Archdiocese for Military Services, and the North American College, in particular, where some of these men have a strong connection to St. Thomas More.

As Christians we shouldn't be surprised to look ourselves in the mirror and own that reality. We are not as strong as we may think. We are time and time again shocked and dismayed by our own weaknesses, our own fears, our own shortcomings.

Should we be careful what we wish for? The apostles asked Jesus to increase their faith, and He told them it would take work. It would take suffering. It would take patience. But He didn't say it was impossible.

As everyday stewards, we need to continue wishing recklessly. Ask God for anything and everything, come to Him with all your needs. Beg Him for grace without limit.

When we hear God's voice, it does not always say what we want to hear. But it always speaks the perfect truth. If it tells us of a hardship that we think we cannot bear, let us take solace in the knowledge that we are the stewards — not the landlord.



We will be accepting nominations for the eight at-large seatson the Parish Council, effective January 1, 2026. The St. Thomas More Parish Council represents the body of the Church, which oversees parish activities, projects, and many other facets of parish life.

The committee is comprised of the Pastor, Religious Education Director, staff members, leaders of various ministries, and eight elected positions.

The elected positions will consist of:

2 parishoners for the 16-22 year old age group

4 parishioners for the 23-59 year old age group

2 parishioners for the 60+ year old age group

Election shall be for a three year term. The Council ordinarily meets four times per year.

You may submit your own name, or that of any other parishioner 16 years or older. If you are submitting the name of someone else, please obtain their permission. Nominations may be dropped off at the parish office, emailed to stmoffice53@gmail.com, or placed in the collection basket during any of the Masses.

Nominations will be accepted for two weeks, from Sunday, September 28 to Sunday, October 12.

All nominees will then be contacted to verify their acceptance and obtain some general background information.

On October 25 & 26, we will list in the bulletin, all those running for office, along with a brief bio of all the candidates.

On the weekends of November 2 & 9, ballots will be in the bulletin and available at all church entrances for parishoners to vote. This will be a two week period.

On the weekend of November 16th, results will be published in the bulletin.

MERCY 21

"Be merciful as your Father is merciful." (Luke 6:36)

In a world full of concerns and pressure—jobs, the economy, immigration, poverty and need, war, violence, discord, divisions and polarization in our country, even divisions within the Church—what can we do? How can we accompany others in such difficult times?

Bishop Bruce Lewandowski says that amidst all of this "what's missing right now is mercy." Our bishop invites all people of good will to join him on MERCY21, a 21 day journey to reflect on, exercise, and pray for mercy beginning on Sunday, September 14, the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, and ending with the Memorial of Saint Faustina on Sunday, October 5.

Each day, participants will be guided in: a Reflection on mercy, a practical way to Exercise mercy, and a Prayer for mercy.

Together, these daily REPs (Reflection, Exercise, Prayer) will draw from the 7-Spiritual Works of Mercy, the 7-Corporal Works of Mercy, and the 7-Principles of Catholic Social Teaching.

Bishop Bruce extends his personal invitation: "I ask you to join me for 21 days of mercy. We will reflect on, exercise, and pray for mercy—asking the Lord's mercy for ourselves, and sharing His mercy with others."
