

St. Veronica Chapel Tabernacle History

We are blessed in our parish to have two beautiful tabernacles in our churches. At St. Veronica Chapel we are blessed to have the tabernacle that was placed at the Aldrich Mansion chapel when the seminary opened in 1941. The new chapel was built in 1956 and a new tabernacle was placed at the main altar. The tabernacle was in a side chapel at the new church.

In 2000, Bishop Mulvee graciously offered to Msgr. Halloran, and he was granted use of the tabernacle for the new St. Veronica Chapel. The tabernacle was the focus of hundreds of men contemplating priesthood and spiritual fatherhood. Now since 2000 this "house of bread" is again holding Christ for us to contemplate.

It is lovely as it is adorned with wheat, the biblical notion of dying to oneself to feed the other as Jesus has done for us. It was custom to have the tabernacle veiled often times to remind the adorers of the "Holy of Holies" and the curtain in the temple.

As we continue to have gratitude for our past and consecrate our future we are grateful for this special tabernacle that reminds us to pray for priestly vocations.

On this retired priests support weekend, I also thought it appropriate to show the yearbook picture of our own Msgr. Halloran from the Our Lady of Providence Seminary yearbook. We are grateful that he has blessed us with his ministry for so long. God bless Msgr. Halloran and all of our retired priests.




